The persecuted church: India (Contact: Ken Nash)

Violence against Christians in India is on the rise, as Hindu nationalism grows and anti-conversion laws are being used against Christians. These laws are intended to target conversion by force or allurement; however, the loose wording means any kind of charitable act can be considered a form of bribery. Since 2020 the US Commission of International Religious Freedom has repeatedly urged the US to designate India as "a country of particular concern". From 2022 to 2023 the persecution has risen more than 45 per cent. One of the worst offending states is Uttar Pradesh, although the High Court there recently came to the defence of accused Christians. Release International said they would be "looking for it to take effect throughout the state".

Heart News

London City Mission (Contact: Elizabeth Bridger)

LCM's CEO Graham Miller and his wife Alison were violently attacked in a London street recently in front of their young daughter by a gang after they intervened when the gang were harassing a local shopkeeper. Alison was worse off than Graham as they continued beating her over the head when she fell to the ground. They have said they forgive the gang members. All girls. There are several such gangs in that area.

There is a rise in the number of homeless people in London. LCM is seeking to increase their response to the problem of homelessness.

The ministry at Webber Street Centre continues to serve many homeless people daily with hot meals, fresh clothes and showers and gentle Gospel presentations with generous friendship.

LCM is launching a new Evangelism Resource Hub for Christians to bridge gaps and enable them to share the Gospel more effectively. Three quarters of Christians say they find it difficult to share their faith.

Surveys show that half of all Londoners don't know any Christians. This is termed 'Gospel Poverty'. LCM seeks to help people build bridges 'Start with one Person! 'is great advice!

This is all about equipping all Christians, not just ministers, to be more effective witnesses for Christ.

Pray for the Protection, Perseverance and Provision of all the needs of each missionary for their spiritual and physical wellbeing as they serve the Lord sacrificially.

This month:

- Praise God, visitors to the Cromer Parish Church during the 2nd December lights switch-on event were offered and took 124 New Testaments. One was to a pupil who said she was learning German, so was pleased to receive a NT in that language. A police constable accepted a New Testament with the North Norfolk Constabulary badge on the front cover. Many of these folk would not possess a Bible nor dream of buying one for themselves. Please pray that the scriptures given might be used by the Holy Spirit to bring these people to saving faith.
- Please pray that year 7 students in Stalham High School and Cromer Academy, who received Youth Testaments last term, will read them. Also, that the 20 large print New Testaments delivered to Sidestrand Hall School will be used by staff and students.
- During this term we will be contacting more North Norfolk senior schools to see if they will allow us to take an assembly and offer year 7 pupils Youth Testaments.

 Our Scriptures are delivered to a garage in Holt. Unfortunately, a ringworm infected cat entered this storage area. Please pray that not too much of the stock will need to be destroyed. Fortunately, much of the stock was sealed and can be used following the fumigation.

Jon Kuhrt, CEO of Hope into Action sends the following message:

"To bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes...and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair."

- Isaiah 61

Antonio was homeless and sleeping rough with a life dominated by addiction and despair. As he explains what his life was like: "I can sum it up in one word: hopeless. I was deep into addiction...cold, lonely...I had pushed away everyone that loved me, and I was on the streets with no way out."

But through the support of Hope into Action and its wonderful partner church, Antonio has found security, dignity and hope.

 Pray for a New Year full of love and hope for employees (especially those in Norwich), partner churches and befrienders within them, and above all, for the tenants, past, present and future.

Bible Society (Contact: David Anderson)

The Bible Society 'Open The Book' programme and material provide a means whereby we can bring the bible stories that enriched and blessed us to the local schools. In Cromer we are involved in weekly presentation to the Junior School and fortnightly to the Infant's School. We are not alone in this as other churches also involve themselves with their local schools.

In devastating circumstances, mission teams in the Bible Lands are committed to their mission of providing aid, comfort and spiritual guidance to the people in the region.

Both Bible Society offices in Gaza have been caught in airstrikes. The building that housed the surviving office was demolished in an attack.

Staff members have been wounded and other staff have lost their homes to bombardment.

Nashat Filmon's dedicated Bible team has been actively involved in relief efforts, continuing their support for Christians in the area. 'We formed a crisis team,' Nashat says. 'We're monitoring the situation and trying to provide as much help as possible. We are in daily contact with local and church leaders in the Gaza Strip and have maintained an open line of communication with them and will continue doing so.'

A literacy project is transforming the lives of Christian women in Pakistan. Christians make up less than two per cent of Pakistan's overwhelmingly Muslim population and they are often targeted by extremists. Gaining an ability to read the Bible and write also helps them to find employment.

Mission Without Borders (MWB) (Contact: Anne Attfield)

- Praise God that there has been a generous response to the appeal for money for MWB's Christmas love boxes which are filled with food, treats and the gospel message. This year 42,000 boxes have been sent to families and vulnerable people in need across the poorest countries in Eastern Europe.
- Please continue to pray for the team in the UK office and the family of John Chamberlain, MWB's UK National Director, as they mourn his unexpected death after a heart attack.
- Continue to pray for MWB's work in Ukraine which is now the
 poorest country in Europe due to the war. Pray for MWB's
 ministry to refugees, displaced and poor people, which is very
 challenging but much blessed. Continue to pray for two of MWB's
 staff members whose brothers have died on the front line.
- Pray for the homeless families in Bulgaria who are part of MWB's 'Street Mercy' project. Pray that God will touch their hearts and make a way for them to get back on their feet again.
