Give a brief description of the work of the Mission Partner as it relates to this nomination.

'Mission Without Borders' has been working in Eastern Europe for over 60 years. Its purpose has remained the same - to reach people for Christ, helping people out of poverty into a sustainable future, working closely with local churches in six Eastern European countries to bring 'life in all its fulness' to families whose living conditions are poor, with few opportunities to create a better future for themselves and their children.

*The six countries where the mission works are: -
Albania, Bosnia, Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Moldova,
Romania and Ukraine*

How does the work of this proposed Mission Partner demonstrate a good 'fit' with our Vision Statement, and meet the criteria of "sharing the love of Jesus with others"?

As a Church family we have recently supported 'Mission Without Borders' as one of our mission partners. Their work definitely demonstrates a good "fit" with our vision statement in that its work is "sharing the love of Jesus with others."

I quote the mission's purpose statement:-

"Our purpose remains the same as it did over 60 years ago - reaching people for Christ. For us that means living out the truth of God's love, redemptive power in Eastern Europe through acts of service & long term help for people living in poverty. Our support is spiritual, emotional, educational, material and social, addressing the whole person, in order that there may be a lasting transformation. Our hope is to see people fulfilling their God-given potential, set free from all that hindered them, with hope for the future."

How could we (as a church and as individuals) become involved with their work?

MWB has worked in partnership with local churches in E. Europe and invites us to join as a Church family in the one-mission of proclaiming & demonstrating the love of God in those countries.

The staff in the UK office are keen to share resources with us and would be happy to arrange a visit to talk about the work of the mission. There is information on their website about the wide range of practical help they give to people through having local knowledge & understanding of cultural norms by working with local churches in the six countries.

We can become involved by praying specifically for the work. Every two months a prayer diary is issued with prayer requests from staff working in each of the six countries.

We can be involved by donating money regularly. There are usually specific appeals for extra funds for paying for children to go to camp in the summer, providing backpacks with writing materials for children to go to school, providing Christmas food & gift parcels etc. plus opportunities to sponsor children & families.
