The Persecuted Church

Yemen

Yemeni Christians are very vulnerable in the chaos of war and humanitarian crisis.

Most have converted from Islam and must practise their faith in absolute secrecy or risk a death sentence. Those who aren't legally punished are likely to be disowned and persecuted by their family and community.

Last year, Western airstrikes were framed by the Houthis as 'Christian aggression', pushing believers further underground. Most foreign Christians have now fled Yemen. But many Yemeni believers bravely want to stay and serve their people. In fact, the small church is steadily growing.

Please pray:

- That peace will finally come to Yemen;
- for courage and hope for the Yemenis who risk their lives to follow Jesus;
- that secret churches will be able to meet, and leaders find the strength to keep serving.

Open Doors

- Give thanks that I continue to adjust to life here and working in the SIM-UK office

Teso Development Fund (Contact: Frances Britton)

Funds were sent to PAG (Pentecostal Assemblies of God) North in August to start a one-year training programme for 210 pastors. Training is done in blocks over a weekend to minimise the disruptions to family life and other commitments. Topics include, among others; Understanding and Knowing God, Sin and Salvation, Bible Interpretation, Understanding Pastoral Care, Evangelism and Church Planting, Biblical Discipleship and Leadership in the 21st Century. TDT has funded this course in the past with much success and was fortunate to be awarded a grant to fund this particular round of training.

In the September Prayer Diary I mentioned that during the Carnival Day, we had offered Scriptures from the church to those who passed by. Praise God we were able to give 78 Seaside New Testaments, 38 A5 Seaside Hope and 25 Explore magazines. Please pray that these scriptures will be read and that the Holy Spirit will use the word to bring the reader to a saving knowledge of Christ.

This term we will be busy as we ring the North Norfolk secondary schools to see if they will accept a delivery of New Testaments for year 7 pupils. Unfortunately, fewer schools have agreed to take the scriptures. Some schools have refused the offer saying they are inclusive schools and do not wish to offend their pupils.

Please pray that schools will allow their pupils to have the option of receiving the gift of a New Testament. Praise God Cromer Academy have already received 145 Youth Testaments for their pupils.

Nepal flood disaster

The loss of life, families wiped out or loved ones missing, along with widespread destruction of road networks, bridges and communication lines has made the scale of this disaster incomprehensible. "Nowhere feels safe: this trauma could last for generations" warns Tearfund's Nepal country

director, amid fears of secondary flashflooding. Three of Tearfund's local partners are already in the affected area to assess what the greatest needs are and how we can respond.

- **Pray** for those people affected, those grieving lost loved ones, those who are displaced, and those waiting for news of missing people.
- **Pray** for the rescue workers, first responders and local leaders as they try to reach the most vulnerable.
